Catriona is an Assistant Professor at the School of Nursing and Human Sciences in DCU with extensive experience in Ageing and Community Health. Her research interests lie in population health and health services research. She completed a HRB funded post-doctoral fellowship at the Irish Longitudinal Study on Ageing (TILDA) and has published a number of peer reviewed articles and commissioned reports on the cardiovascular health of older Irish adults. She is a member of the Blood Pressure Council of the Irish Heart Foundation (IHF) and a member of the Nurses and Allied Health Professionals working party of the British and Irish Hypertension Society (BIHS).</p> <p>Ms Ruth Morrow: Advanced Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Ruth has worked as an Advanced Nurse Practitioner (Primary Care) and nurse prescriber which focused on the management of chronic disease. Her current role as a nurse educator and consultant has seen the development of a number of education programmes on asthma, COPD, diabetes and hypertension accredited by the Nursing & Midwifery Board of Ireland. She also provides consultancy services to the Asthma Society of Ireland and to the Irish Practice Nurses Association.</p> <p>Ms Roisin Doogue: Practice Nurse Roisin has been working in General Practice for the past 17 years developing clinical expertise in all elements of nursing in general practice including chronic disease management. She is currently a PhD candidate in the University of Limerick. She is a member of the Irish team in UL along with Prof. Liam Glynn on a multi-centre study TASMINS (Towards an Integrated self-monitoring solution for stroke or TIA) in collaboration with Prof. Richard McManus who is leading the team in Oxford.</p>
